Christ Is All

Colossians 4:2-18

Introduction

As we wrap up our study of Colossians, we finish by applying the themes of the book to **Colossians 4:2-6**. We see that because of who Christ is, we have access to the Father and can bring our requests before God. Because of what He has done, we should look for opportunities to tell others the message of the Gospel. Because Christ has removed our old life, our lives will look different than those around us, which creates opportunities to talk about Him. When those opportunities arise, the new life He has given us enables us to respond appropriately to any situation.

Main Idea:

Christ is all, in every area of life.

Discussion

- 1) What are some practical ways you can stay “devoted to prayer”?
- 2) The theme of “thanksgiving” has come up several times in this book. Why should our prayers be saturated with thanksgiving?
- 3) What does an “open door” look like? How can we recognize when God is moving in someone’s heart?
- 4) When have you seen God open the door for you to share about Christ?
- 5) What does it mean to make the Gospel clear in our speech? How can we obscure that?
- 6) Who are you regularly around who is an “outsider”? What opportunities do you have to share the Gospel with them?
- 7) What makes speech gracious? Paul uses the picture of salt – how does our relationship with Christ “flavor” our words?
- 8) What is your biggest takeaway from our study of Colossians?

Application

- 1) As we wrap up Colossians, is there anything God has called you to do in obedience that you have not yet done?
- 2) Honestly evaluate your prayer life. Can you say you are “devoted to prayer”? If not, what changes do you need to make?
- 3) Who will you tell about Jesus this week?
